

POLICY FOR RESERVATION IN ADMISSION (2023-24)

The policy to be followed by the Indian Statistical Institute (ISI) for reservation in admission to its degree and diploma programmes is in concordance with the *Central Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission) Act, 2006*.

The number of seats for each non-JRF programme is given by the following table.

Reservation of Seats for Scheduled Caste / Tribe (SC/ST) Candidates

- 22.5% of the numbers of seats in each of the non-JRF programmes are reserved for candidates belonging to SC/ST (15% for SC and 7.5% for ST). However, the interchangeability rule will apply. Reserved seats for ST candidates remaining vacant will be open to SC candidates and vice-versa.
- A candidate belonging to SC/ST category will get 30% relaxation on the General Qualifying Score at each stage of the selection process.
- SC/ST students who get selected with respect to the general cut-off will not be considered as part of this reserved quota. SC/ST candidates will be required to produce original Scheduled caste/tribe certificate issued by a competent authority in the prescribed format at the time of interview, if he/she is shortlisted for interview.

Reservation of Seats for Other Backward Classes - Non-Creamy layer (OBC-NCL)

- 27% seats of the numbers of seats in each of the non-JRF programmes are reserved for the candidates belonging to OBC-NCL. A candidate belonging to OBC-NCL category will get 10% relaxation on the General Qualifying Score at each stage of the selection process.
- OBC-NCL candidates who get selected with respect to the general cut-off will not be considered as part of this reserved quota. OBC-NCL candidates will be required to produce original certificate issued by a competent authority in the prescribed format at the time of the interview, if he/she is shortlisted for interview.

Reservation of Seats for Economically Weaker Sections (EWS)

- 10% seats of the numbers of seats in each of the non-JRF programmes are reserved for the candidates belonging to EWS. A candidate belonging to EWS category will not get any relaxation on the General Qualifying Score at any stage of the selection process.
- EWS candidates who get selected with respect to the general cut-off will not be considered as part of this reserved quota. EWS candidates will be required to produce original certificate issued by a competent authority in the prescribed format at the time of the interview, if he/she is shortlisted for interview.
- EWS seats will remain vacant in the absence of eligible candidates from the given category.

Reservation of Seats for Persons with Disability (PwD) Candidates

- Five percent (5%) of seats of the non-JRF programmes are horizontally reserved (that is, in each category (ST, SC, OBC-NCL, PwD and GEN)) for candidates with benchmark disabilities, as per the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016, that is, the benefit of reservation will only be given to a candidate “with not less than forty per cent. of a specified disability where specified disability has not been defined in measurable terms and includes a person with disability where specified disability has been defined in measurable terms, as certified by the certifying authority.”

- A candidate belonging to the PwD category will get a relaxation of 30% on the General Qualifying Score at each stage of the selection process. Such candidates will be required to produce original certificate issued by district medical board/competent authority at the time of the interview if he/she is shortlisted for interview.

Reservation of Seats in the case of JRF programmes

Candidates of OBC-NCL/ SC/ ST/ PwD categories get relaxation on the General Qualifying Score in their respective categories at each stage of the selection process, as in the case of non-JRF programmes. Seats are not specifically reserved in the case of JRF programmes. However, the score of a candidate of the categories mentioned above will be multiplied by an appropriate factor before the candidate is placed in the merit list. Such candidates will be required to produce original certificate issued by a competent authority in the prescribed format at the time of the interview if he/she is shortlisted for interview.

- The score of a candidate belonging to the SC/ST category will be multiplied by a factor of $10/7$ before it is used for preparing the final merit list.
- The score of a candidate belonging to the OBC-NCL category will be multiplied by a factor of $10/9$ before it is used for preparing the final merit list.
- The score of a PwD candidate, irrespective of the SC/ST/OBC-NCL/EWS/General status, will be multiplied by a factor of $10/7$ before it is used for preparing the final merit list.
